



The Computational Engineering, Chemical Engineering, Data Science, Digital Systems and Design and Quantum Technology majors are all part of Aalto University's English-medium Bachelor's Programme in Science and Technology. Guild Activities for Fuksis

Various events as well as the guilds and other associations in general at Otaniemi are widely based on voluntary work. For example all of our guilds officials execute their role solely based on their own interests. This gives everyone the chance to execute themselves freely and make an impact on how it's like in the Guild of Civil Engineers.

Our guild offers fuksis many ways to take part in arranging guild activities. Here we will introduce some of the roles that might most excite fuksis. Excluding the fuksicommittee all of these "guild official roles" are decided in the guilds official meeting in November, but if you are interested in taking part in the committees before that just let us know! Everyone's welcome to take part even before that.

RaJa - Building committee

RaJa - named after building committee in finnish - is a committee that concentrates on building an assortment of fun stuff for the guild members. Most important and crucially related to fuksis are the Otatarha's racecar and sledging racer that will take part in fuksi competition throughout the year.

Little-hosts and hostesses

The little-hosts and -hostesses - pikku-IE - is a group of fuksis helping out the guild's host and hostess. Their primary tasks are helping out at events organized by the IE. This includes cooking, decorating and serving at sitsis. The little-IE is an irreplaceable help at many events. And as they say, the best party is in the kitchen. Come and find out...

UAT Apprentices

The apprentices of the External Affairs Committee (UAT) assist the Guild's Corporate Relations Officer and Excursion Master throughout the year. They acquire supporting members for the Guild from companies, which helps fund the Guild's activities. The apprentices have the opportunity to assist in organizing corporate events and excursions. This includes activities such as searching for excursion destinations and coordinating the actual visits.

Fuksicommittee

The fuksicommittee will be assembled in the beginning of the fall of all interested fuksis. Teekkarius

Teekkarius (being a teekkari) is doing things together and expressing oneself. However, it is something that cannot be fully explained, because in reality is is all about experiencing the teekkari spirit. Here are some basic elements of teekkari life.

Teekkari Culture

Teekkari Culture

Teekkarius is about doing things together, traditions and history, an open mind and some twinkle in the corner of the eye. Teekkarius is an individual journey and experience for everyone and all of us construct our teekkari identity aroud our own experiences and preferences. The culture consist of a bundle of traditions that often play a vital role in what's happening, but at the same time new ones are invented and outdated ones renewed. So don't fret, there are no molds to be filled here.

The teekkari community enables everyone to take part in various associations: guilds, sub-associations or clubs. There are professional associations, cultural and sports clubs, political influencers and international associations. Something for everybody!

Teekkari Cap

For more than a hundred years, the teekkari cap has decorated the heads of teekkaris in its current form. Every fuksi earns the right to place the teekkari cap on their heads on their freshman year wappu while becoming teekkaris. The cap's six corners, cogwheel cockade and tassel signify the wearer's dignity from afar. This special cap is a summer garment and can only be worn from May 1st to the last day of September. Outside of this time, you can separately apply for a license to use it for special occasions.

Overalls

In addition to the teekkari cap, each teekkari own an overalls. Overalls are the perfect outfit choice for ALL occasions and thus Otaniemi is a sea of colour around orientationweek. Depending on their wearer, overalls are often decorated with different patches and other modifications. These often have symbolism to the owner or are common teekkari traditions. The color of the overalls symbol its owners field of study. Although you can and more importantly should have fun in your overalls, everyone must remember that while wearing such outfit you represent all the teekkaris. So let's act accordingly. Raksa fuksis get their construction blue overalls on the Tuesday of orientation week.

Fuksi Points

To receive the teekkari cap for their first possible wappu, each fuksi must collect a sufficient amount of fuksi points during the freashman year. These fuksi points are collected by getiing to know the teekkari culture by taking part in events and other activities. The intension of fuksi points is not to force anyone to take part in every cat crusades, but to present the teekkari culture as widely as possible and encourage everyone to find an activity they like.



Sitsit

Sitsit are an academic table party with singing, eating and mainly enjoying oneself. A three-course dinner with matching drinks is served during the evening. At sitsit we drink what we sing about and sing about what we drink. This whole campaing is lead by song leaders. Depending on the occasion, sitsi program usually houses various performances. The dress code is often festive, but at Niemi it is traditional to have a good amount of sitsis with certain themes.

Annual Balls

The birthdays of various associations such as guilds are celebrated at annual balls. These parties are classy occasions at Otaniemi and nearly without exceptions a white tie event.

The annual balls, or vujut as we call them, begin with a cocktail party, where the boeard of the association accepts gifts. From there, we move to the main party, where a three-course dinner is served while various perfomances and speeches are held. After the main party comes th afterparty and for the lucky fews with energy left the after-after party. The next day the party people will grad themselves to sillis aka herring breakfast

Sillis

Sillis, or "herring breakfast", often follows the previous days ball or sitsis. Despite its name, at sillis you mostly bulk on restorative foods such as mozzarella sticks and enjoy a sana and, in the best case, swimming.

Singing

Teekkaris sing rather than well and this can be clearly heard (pun intended) in Otaniemi.

You can enjoy singing in various choirs in Otaniemi, but singin also fills sitsis, annual balls and sauna evenings. Many guilds have their own songbooks, ours is Hermanni, which contain the lyrics to most of the songs sung.







Excursions, aka excut, mainly mean different kinds of visits to businesses. Excus usually include a more official part at the beginning, where the company presents itself to the students. After this, the focus turn to having fun and haning out. The program often includes some kind of snacking and saunas. Excus also refer to other types of trips outside of Otaniemi.

Sauna

Excursions

Already over tens of thousands of years ago, the early teekkaris refreshed their mind and physical being at saunas. These hot and humid traditions are also continued in our guild. In addition to singing saunas and other sauna evenigs, the saunas of Otaniemi serve as perfect afterparty locations. You will surely find your way to one or more of Otanimi's saunsa: Rantsu, Gorsu, OK 20, Rooftop sauna, Otaranta rooftop sauna and Ossin sauna.

Tempaus

A tempaus is organized at irregularly regular intervals and their are a way teekkaris arouse the interest of the general public to concentrate on a current issue. A tempaus can ba a way to raise money for a public purpose. Tempaus is not a protest, but a good spirited way for the teekkaris to make an influence.

The biggest tempaus in the history is probably the move in 1966 in honor of the Dipoli being built. The teekkaris moved form Helsinki to Otaniemi and organized countless big and small events around the city. The most recent tempaus was organized for the benefit of finnish elemntary schools in 2016.

However, each communty has its own traditions and customs, some of which may date back a long time. Even our own guild has many traditions, both events and other *stuff*, which we want to present to you. Nonetheless, as a guild, we want to offer the widest possible range of activities so that everyone finds something that suits them. This is how, even the longest traditions change over time. Here's a little taste of some of our traditional ways — you'll definitely hear more about them in the future.

Guild Room

Raksa's guild room or kiltis is located at Konelafka at Otakaari 4. The kiltis is a "living room" open to all guild members, where you can study, hang our, drink some coffee or play some playstation. The guild room is a good place to get to know ther guild members and we hope to see many of you pop by. Even if it's jusst for the free coffee!





Hermanninsitsit

Hermanninsitsis, or more familiarly Hessu, is the annual ball of the Guild of Civil Engineers. This jubilee is one of the most refined ones at Otaniemi and full of singing. Hessu is always celebrated on the Friday closest to April 11th. The date is determined by the birthday of Herman Hannelius — an influential and highly regarded professor at the beginning of the last centry. IK's half-year celebration is held during the fall and has been cleverly named puoli-Hessu mening half-Hessu.

RILkamat

The RILkamas are one of the autumn's highlights for raksa students, because we are talking about none other than Raksa's own fuksi party. The whole show, right from the beginning of planing to the gruesome cleaning, is organized by fuksis themselves. The party usually has a theme, some past themes being your childhoods dream profession, elemantry school disco and Halloween. The party looks a little different each year and participating in organizing gives you a chance to get to know your school mates a little better. RILkamat also hosts the first spex performed by fuksis. This is something the older students look forward to eagerly.





IK's pre-christmas party - pIKkujoulut

IK's pre-christmas party gathers guild members together to spend some quality time before leaving for the holidays. The event takes place in the aftermat of the guild's election meeting held earlier in the day. During the evening, we enjoy traditional Chirstmas delicacies such as rice porridge, take part in various programs and go to the sauna. 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Harassment

The guild's purpose is to guarantee a safe and welcoming environment for everyone attending its events, regardless of age, gender, sexual orientation, ethnic background or other personal charasteristics.

The Guild of Civil Engineers does not accept harassment or inappropriate behaviour in any form. Providing a safe space at events for all attenders is of paramount importance.

Offensive and inappropriate behaviour can be, for example, verbal, non-verbal or physical. Sexist and racist jokes, derogatory language, threatening behaviour, unwanted contact, touching without permission and intentional eclusion are all forms of harassment. The experience of harassment is always subjective: what is not distressing or inappropriate for you may be for someone else. Thus the most important thing is the person's own experience of the situation.

Our guild has currently four harassment contact persons who offer help, support and solutions in harassment situations. You can contact a harassment contact person in any situation if you feel like you have been harassed or if you have witnessed harassment. All conversations are confidential, and no actions will be taken without the consent of the person concerned.





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What is AYY?

As a student of Aalto, Aalto University Student Union, AYY, is your student union. AYY brings together about 17,000 students of arts, design, business and technology. We work to ensure the well-being of all our members and we want to develop teaching at Aalto and the best student life in the world.

As a member of AYY, you are entitled to numerous student union services and student benefits both locally and throughout Finland. AYY offers several services for its members, such as affordable student housing, rental facilities, and advocacy. As a student of Aalto, you can also participate in activities and events organised by AYY and over 200 associations within the Student Union.

Services

Student housing

AYY owns approximately 2,700 affordable student apartments in Helsinki and Espoo and offers a home for over 3,400 residents. All degree and exchange students who are members of AYY have the right to apply for AYY's housing. You can apply for housing as soon as your admission is confirmed by the university.

First-year students and students moving from outside the Helsinki metropolitan area are given priority in the allocation of housing. First-year students receive an additional score when they apply for AYY's shared apartment queues. To receive the score, students must apply for housing no later than in July or December, depending on when their studies begin.

You can browse and search for AYY's housing through the Domo system: domo.ayy.fi. As a student, you can also apply for housing from the Foundation for Student Housing in the Helsinki Region (HOAS).

Advocacy and interest representation

AYY represents students' interests and rights on university level and national level, making sure students are being heard in the society! You can take advantage of AYY's advocacy services, for example, if your exam results are late or you may get in touch with an equity officer if you encounter any type of harassment. As a member of AYY, you can apply for administration as a student representative and influence the decisions made at the university.

AYY's highest decision-making body is the Representative Council (Rep-Co), which is elected by vote. In the elections, all AYY members can vote and run as candidates. The next Representative Council elections will be held this autumn. Members of the Representative Council decide on the goals and policies of the Student Union.

Student culture

Volunteering, association activities and diverse events are an essential part of Aalto student culture and the Aalto community. The highlights of the year include Wappu and Orientation week events, annual ball, Shrovetide celebrations and many other events.

In addition to the Student Union, events are organised by volunteers who work in sections and committees. AYY has five sections: Aava Community Section, Campus Section, Teekkari (Technical Student) Section, Museum Section and Advocacy Management Group (more commonly known as EduJory). The call for volunteers will open in late autumn. Information on the call will be published in AYY's communication channels.

In addition, AYY has more than 200 associations that organise activities in the fields of sports, music, games,

and other hobbies. New students are always welcome to join association activities, and AYY offers help, support, and advice for the establishment of associations and their activities. Keep an open mind for different opportunities and get to know the associations in upcoming events!

The Museum of Student Life has expanded its exhibition and activities to cover the student cultures of the entire Aalto community - technology, business and arts. In addition to engineering students' culture, the museum now also presents the history and present of KY - Aalto University Business Students and TOKYO, Students of Art, Design and Architecture. In addition, AYY's art collection will also be presented in the exhibition collections. The museum is located at Jämeräntaival 3A.

Rental facilities

In addition to housing, AYY has numerous saunas, event venues and recreational facilities that members can rent. Some facilities are free of charge. AYY also rents a van.

Scholarships and project grants

You can apply for a project grant from AYY or the TTE-Fund for a project organised by a group of friends or an association. You can also apply for scholarships awarded by AYY.

Student benefits


You will receive a digital or plastic student card to prove your student status (card delivered by Frank). By showing your student status, you are entitled to hundreds of benefits from I Aug onwards, including Kela, Matkahuolto and VR. as well as to student lunch discount in student restaurants. You are also entitled to student discount in public transport in the metropolitan area if you live in the HSL area and have updated your student status in your travel card at the HSL service point. You can find the list of all benefits and discounts available with the student card on Frank's website at frank.fi.

The digital student card Frank App is an official student ID, which you can download and activate starting on I Aug once you have enrolled for attendance at the university and paid AYY's membership fee. You can check the prices of other card options on Frank's website. You can also add an ISIC license to both digital and plastic student cards. 

Internationality

Internationality is growing at Aalto University year by year, and the same goes for our Guild of Civil Engineers. Our guild welcomes approximately 150 new master's level freshmen, most of whom come from abroad. Additionally, we welcome around 30 exchange students, with the majority arriving in the fall and a smaller group in the spring. At the master's level, the atmosphere becomes more international as a large portion of the studies are conducted in English. The Computational Engineering bachelor's program also increases the probability of hearing English in our guild.

The task of the guild's international officials is to welcome both international and national new master's students and exchange students to the university and to teekkari life. Together with the International BIG responsible, a group of around twenty international BIGs, and other internationally-minded people, we organize various events for international and master's students, ranging from sits to sauna evenings. A large portion of the activity is organized together with other guilds of the School of Engineering, i.e. KIK and MK. At our guild's international events, you often come across pink or pink-sleeved overalls. The International Committee (KvTMK) gathers Master's Captains from all the guilds andorganizes events for all Aalto master's fuksis.

We organize a wide range of events among international and master's students, so our activities may not be as visible to bachelor's freshmen. However, if you are interested in international activities, don't hesitate to reach out to any of us international guild officials. :)



SCHOOL OF ENGINEERING - ENG



Maanmittarikilta, The Guild of Surveying Engineers, is the association for students in the degree program of Built Environment. **MK**, established in 1901, is the oldest guild that still receives new students every year. You can spot the members of the guild by their matte black overalls with a fuchsia colored sleeve. The MK guildroom, Monttu (it means a gob or a pit), is located at the K1 building.



The Guild of Civil Engineers, more commonly known as "Raksa", is a student organization that was founded in 1913 and accepts undergraduates studying Civil Engineering and Computational Engineering. The association, which was originally named "Engineers' Club" aka IK, is Otaniemi's third oldest guild that still accepts fuksis. From 2013 to 2021, the main field of study for bachelor's degree students joining the guild was energy and environmental engineering. Raksa members are easily identified by their builders blue overalls with a green sleeve and pocket and their legendary chant of "RAKSA JAK-SAA" ("Raksa perseveres!")

The Guild of Mechanical Engineers was founded in 1915, and even with 107 years of history, it is the youngest guild in the School of Engineering. However, it is one of the biggest guild's with over thousand members. Members of **KIK** can be recognized by their cheerful pink overalls, their pink caterpillar tractor mascot and their jubilant chants of "Yy, kaa, KO, NE!" ("one, two, THREE, FOUR/MACHINE").

SCHOOL OF ELECTRICAL ENGINEERING - ELEC

The Guild of Electrical Engineers was founded in 1921. The energetic electrical engineers can be identified by their pure white overalls with the new cog logo on the back of the overalls. You can also spot the old lightbulb logo from older students' overalls. Their overalls are also decorated by a depiction of a telegram on their right thigh pockets. These overalls can be seen on **SIK** fuksis from day one, as they are the first guild to receive their overalls in Otaniemi. SIK's chant is "Jappadaida, jappadaida, Hei, hyvä SIK!"

The Guild of Automation and Systems Technology AS is a subject association founded in 1998. It brings together students majoring in Automation and Robotics, Information Technology as well as Digital Systems and Design. The industrious members can be recognised by violet overalls. The left sleeve is black with a white pocket and that reminds of shared history with TiK and SIK.



The Guild of Bioinformation Technology (Inkubio) was founded in 2007. As the result of a historic spelling mistake, Inkubio's overalls are a reddish brown, and they are decorated with white "cow" patches, which guild members sew on themselves, to commemorate the time when they were part of the Guild of Electrical Engineers. On their backs, they proudly carry their logo, Maikki, a circuit board in the shape of a cow.

SCHOOL OF CHEMICAL ENGINEERING - CHEM



The Association of Process Engineering Students welcomes Chemical Engineering students in both the Finnish and English bachelor programme. Founded in 2012, **PT** is one of the youngest student associations in Otaniemi. PT's overalls are a bright blue and have three stripes, yellow, blue, and red, on each limb as a reminder of the three old guilds that PT decends from. The association's logo can be found on the back: it depicts a Bourdon tube pressure gauge measuring pressure, one of the most important variables in any process.

SCHOOL OF SCIENCE - SCI

The Guild of Physics (aka Fyysikkokilta, FK) is a subject association founded in 1947. It gathers under one roof all Engineering Physics and Mathematics students as well as Quantum Technology students in Aalto. Each Engineering Physics and Mathematics student specializes in either physics, or mathematics and systems sciences. The guild's overalls are natural white. In order to get the right shade, fuksis dye their overalls with tea. The left sleeve for Quantum Technology students is beige.

The Guild of Industrial Engineers (Prodeko) was founded in 1966, although it says 1866 in their overalls due to a legendary mistake. Although the guild only has a small intake, their members are all the more active! Industrial Engineers can be recognised by their white overalls, which are decorated with rainbows. New fuksis design the overalls from the ground up and put them on for the first time in November at the Sikajuhlat, to which you are also warmly welcome!

Tietokilta, or Computer Science Guild, is a student association founded in 1986. Computer Science Guild is one of the largest in Otaniemi. Many of younger guilds in Otaniemi today have started as a part of this guild, such as AS, Athene and Data Guild. Members of the guild can be found wearing shiny black overalls with the guild's unofficial white @-logo in the back. The chant of the guild can be heard from far away as a two-part call-and-response: "tieto- KILTA!"

Athene, Guild of Information Networks, was founded by its students in 1999, and includes now for the first year ever also the students of technological psychology. Athene's overalls are a forest green or "Athene green". The overalls' left sleeve, collars and back pockets are black as a tribute to when Athene separated from the Computer Science Guild in 2003. The eye of Athene is the official logo which can be spotted from the overalls.

Data Guild is the guild for students of the degree programme in Data Science. Founded in 2019, it is the youngest guild in Otaniemi. The members of Data Guild have two different overalls. The older ones are shiny black with a silver sleeve and the current ones are shiny silver with a black sleeve to commemorate the time of Data Science students as part of the Computer Science Guild.

SCHOOL OF ARTS AND ARCHITECTURE



The Guild of Architecture was founded in 1908 and is Otaniemi's second oldest guild still receiving fuksis. It is home to students of Architecture, Landscape Architecture and Interior Architecture, so the members are a mix of students with technical and artistic backgrounds. The Guild of Architecture's overalls are off-white ("painter white") and made of very easily soiled cotton. The logo on the back of the overalls is different each year, as it is designed by the fuksis themselves.

STUDENT NATION

Teknologföreningen, TF, is the Swedish-speaking and the only student nation at Aalto. Everyone is welcome to TF despite study programme or language. The only requirement is to be interested in learning or speaking Swedish. Teknologföreningen's spaces and its own student restaurant are located in Urdsgjallar, the big concrete building next to Dipoli. TF-members are recognized from their dark red, also known as technology red, overalls.



AA-Clubs

MAIK ry is an association that unites the Guild of Surveying Engineering, Architecture and Civil Engineering. The purpose is to create relaxed collaboration and networking with other students that in the future will be working closely together in the same field. MAIK's activities mainly consist of traditional events held throughout the year, the first of which is just around the corner.

What is my bachelor's programme?

The Chemical Engineering, Computational Engineering, Data Science, Digital Systems and Design and Quantum Technology majors are all part of Aalto University's English-medium Aalto Bachelor's Programme in Science and Technology, jointly organised by all four Aalto schools of technology. The Chemical Engineering major is run by the School of Chemical Engineering, Computational Engineering by the School of Engineering, Data Science major by the School of Science, Digital Systems and Design by the School of Electrical Engineering and finally, the Quantum Technology major is run jointly by the schools of Science and Electrical Engineering.

The contents of your studies depend on the major that you originally applied for and gained admission to. Students in all majors are required to complete a 65-credit core curriculum, referred to as basic studies, which focuses on mathematical and computational methods and provides students with a solid foundation in information technology skills. The degree programme also includes 65 credits of studies towards the major, 20–25 credits of studies towards the minor and 25–30 credits for electives. Once you have completed all these elements, you will be awarded a Bachelor of Science (Technology) degree worth 180 credits.

Orientation week

Your studies will begin with an orientation week, running from Monday 28 August to Friday 1 September 2023. Orientation week will give you additional information about your programme, Aalto University as an academic environment and student life on campus. Orientation week gives you a chance to get to know your new fellow students and the staff of the programme. You will be assigned to a tutoring group to help you get off to a good start with your studies. The orientation week schedule will be published at the latest in August on Starting your studies website where you can also find other helpful information concerning the start of your studies: Starting your studies | Aalto University

Timetables of the academic year

The first courses will start on Monday, 4 September 2023. Teaching in the academic year 2023-2024 is divided into five seven-week periods. The final week of each period is an evaluation week reserved for the finalisation of coursework, presentation of course results and evaluation of student performance with various methods. Classes may also be held during the final week. In addition to the evaluation weeks, additional evaluation periods will be organised outside the teaching periods.

Timetable

As a first-year student, or fuksi in Finnish, you will be provided with a model timetable (or recommended study schedule) covering the courses that you are recommended to take in the first academic year. You can find the timetable on the Student Guide of your programme before the start of the academic year: Recommended timetable

If you follow the model timetable, you will earn the recommended number of credits (60 credits) in your first year. The first-year curriculum includes e.g. basic courses in programming, mathematics, an Introduction Course for Bachelor's students and language courses. You should be prepared to work hard and invest time in your studies, because studying at the university level is different from studying at upper secondary school and requires more independent work.

Course registration policy

You need to register for each course you want to take. This is done online using the Sisu system. During the orientation week you will be guided in creating your first study plan (HOPS) in Sisu and how to register for the courses you will have in the first teaching period. You will need to have a course selected on your study plan in Sisu to be able to register for it.

Each course is worth a specific number of credits, which will be entered into your student register when you have passed the course. By definition, 1 credit is equivalent to 26.7 hours of student work.

Completing courses

Course teaching methods vary and may include jects. The first lecture will cover all the practical matters needed to pass the course (registration, examination, assignment, study material, course completion), so you have good reason to be there! Though lecture attendance is usually not compulsory, it is definitely beneficial from a learning standpoint. Many courses have assignments, and in some cases they are compulsory. In other courses, you can do assigned work for extra credit to supplement the total points received on interim tests and the final examination. Whatever the case, maths exercises are always important, because they give you the opportunity to apply what you have learned in practice. In-class exercises in mathematics, called laskarit, include reviews of the subjects covered in the lectures. The exercises are often given out online in advance.

Aalto.fi, Aalto University website, is the main source of information on studies, university services and other matters related to your future alma mater. Course books

In general, courses have a course book and/or lecture materials as teaching material. Course books can be found in Aalto University's library, university department libraries, and sometimes also in city libraries. Of course, you can also hunt for books in bookstores. However, it is often worth asking your own BIGs and other senior students about used books. In many courses, however, studying is mainly based on lecture materials and electronic content, while books are left to the side. Even then, however, acquiring books is definitely useful! Searching and borrowing books: primo.aalto.fi

Exams

The first exam included in the course is called the course exam. When you register for the course, you usually also register for the course exam. So there is no separate registration for the course exam like other exams, for which you have to register normally. You will receive an email confirmation of registering for the course, course exam and exam. It is advisable to start preparing for the exams in time so that the scope of the subject does not surprise you. However, if you do not pass the exam the first time, at least one more possibility to take the course exam is usually organized. You should ask the course staff for information about different possibilities.

Academic freedom

Studying at a university is significantly different from studying for example at a high school. With academic freedom comes academic responsibility. When studying at the university, you are responsible for your own studies and their progress.

Study counseling and study guidance

Study guidance and counseling are offered by many different parties, such as BIG persons, the guild's Master of Studies, learning services staff: study advisors, study secretaries, coordinators, planners, study supervisors and academic supervisors. You can always contact the learning services staff for all questions related to your studies. Course teachers and other course staff give course-specific advice.

Other majors of the guild

Many of the other students in the guild are not studying in the same major as you. In addition to the Computational Engineering program, our guild welcomes in Finnish-speaking Civil Engineering freshmen. There are also students from previous finnish bachelor program Energy and Environmental Engineering in our guild. However don't be afraid, there is a strong Raksa spirit (builder spirit) that unites the guild, and you will surely find like-minded guild members even among the older members. The students of Computational Engineering also form a tight group, where you will definitely find new friends! Master of Studies and other guild officials are also happy to help and answer questions.

Support for studies

Protection of student rights

One of the tasks of the guild is to advocate for students in matters related to their studies. In practice, this means addressing any inappropriate actions by teachers. The main responsibility for advocacy within the guild lies with the study officer, who maintains constant communication with the university by participating in administrative meetings. In addition to the study officer, there are other student representatives, called "hallopeds," present at the administrative meetings. Hallopeds can be found in every administrative section. Anyone can apply to become a halloped, regardless of previous experience. The term lasts for one calendar year, and applications open in the latter part of the year.

Master of Studies

If before, during, or after the course, something bothers you about the course or its arrangements, contact the guild's Master of Studies, Sofia! She is in charge of studies, monitors the interests of the students and, in case of problems, talks with the necessary university bodies so that the studies goes as fluently as possible for the students.

Support and advice for studies

Studying at university requires more independent work than in high school or upper secondary school. As an adult, you are expected to learn how to find the information you need on your own. Fortunately, there are many sources of help available.

An academic advisor is assigned to every first-year student for the duration of their bachelor's studies, that is the first three years. Advisors arrange both group and individual meetings with their students. Academic advisors belong to the university's research and teaching faculty, usually as professors, associate professors or university lecturers. Academic advising is a form of guidance aimed at developing the student's own initiative and goal-setting, and at giving students the chance to get to know at least one academic staff member a bit better. During first-year studies, academic advising is a part of the Introduction Course for Bachelor's Students.

You can always turn to student services if you are unsure about where to start or whom to ask about something. The coordinator and planning officer of the programme, as well as other student services staff will be happy to help. Student services can assist you with matters involving:

- questions related to studies
- approval of your personal study plan (HOPS)
- graduating with a Bachelor or Master of Science (Technology) degree
- getting transcripts of records or certificates of student status
- registration for the academic year
- tuition-fee payments
- student exchange
- transfer of credits

In fact, student services can assist you with almost anything related to your studies, and if not, they can probably direct you to someone who can.

Student services for all majors of the Aalto Bachelor's Programme in Science and Technology are located in the Computer Science building, floor 1, corridor B. They can also be reached at bsc.tech@aalto.fi.

Student Service Point at the School of Science can help you with general matters, for instance receiving documents such as certificate of student status and official study transcript or getting help with enrolment. Aalto University's student union, or AYY, owns several residential buildings around Espoo and Helsinki. Leave the housing application in time - the most popular apartments can have very long queues (up to 1,5 years). domo.ayy.fi



In addition to AYY, housing with student friendly prices in the capital region is offered by the HOAS (Foundation for student housing in the Helsinki region). The foundation also has apartments in Otaniemi! hoas.fi



Check if you are eligible for Kelas (The Social Insurance Institution of Finland) financial aid. Apply for financial aid as soon as possible to avoid biggest queues. https://www.kela.fi/web/en/financial-aid-for-students

Cards and travelling



The Helsinki Region Transport (HSL or HRT) app help you get around the capital region, in which you can pay for your trip on public transport, from buses to Suomenlinna ferry. The application can be found from your phone's application store. hsl.fi



Get a student card. You need it when paying in student restaurants or to take advantage of student discounts on public transport. Many place in Finland provide student discounts, so it is worth to ask for it when purchasing items or services! The student card is completely free and you can get the Frank App or a physical card. frank.fi



The campus is large and the inexperienced can easily get lost in the neverending jungle of the buildings. Download the Aalto Space application to your phone from your app store, which allows you to navigate the campus area inside and outside the buildings, as well as reserve study spaces.



Otaniemi and the campus area have very good opportunities for light traffic. We recommend taking advantage of them and getting for example a bicycle for smooth movement! The campus also has, for example, city bike stations, which improve connections from and in Otaniemi even more.



There are great sports opportunities in and around the campus area. Do not hesitate to take advantage of them! The nature trails start from the campus area and there are different fields around the sports field. If you are looking for gym services, check out Unisport!

Useful applications



Telegram is a common messaging platform similar to WhatsApp in Otaniemi and Aalto, which is much more practical for large group sizes and for use on different devices. You can download it from your phone's app store. Join the fuksichat! https://bit.ly/compeng23



MobilePay is a must-have application. You also get a conveniently student discount on your lunch if you connect it to your student card. Overall tags and other small purchases can also be handled smoothly when you run out of cash. Suitable for customers of all banks. Carrying cash at events is also recommended!



Facebook has become quieter as a social media in recent years, but in Otaniemi it is used to make event announcements. In practice, all major events, from private parties to afterparties and sports events are still marketing themselves via Facebook.

During the summer, it is advisable to activate your own Aalto username, through which you will also receive an aalto.fi email address. Course bulletins, school news-letters and the guild's Fuksi captains newsletters are sent via e-mail. It's worth learning to read school e-mail along with your previous personal e-mail. 


