


Aalto University - where science and art meet technology and business

Aalto University was established in 2010 as three leading Finnish universities, the Helsinki School of Economics, Helsinki University of Technology and the University of Art and Design Helsinki, were merged. Today, Aalto University consists of six schools with around 12 000 students, and 4 000 members of faculty and staff, of which nearly 400 are professors. University's campus is in Otaniemi, home of the lively community that supports learning, innovation and fun. (aalto.fi)

MEMBERSHIP BENEFITS

STUDENT CARD

By joining the student union you may apply online for a student card at WWW.FRANK.FI. You can choose either a digital card (mobile app, Finnish ID number required) or a plastic card. The card is available for you through the app in seconds, the plastic card will arrive in 2-3 weeks. Showing the official student card is the easiest way to prove your student identity to gain student benefits:

- » Discounted meals at student restaurants
- Student discount on trains and buses
- » Fulltime access to Unisport services 145 euros a year
- » Discounts at museums, theatres, shops, sports facilities and many other places

STUDENT HOUSING

AYY owns approximately 2.600 student apartments in Helsinki and Espoo. Members of AYY are entitled to apply for AYY housing. You can apply for an apartment as soon as you receive confirmation of receiving a study place at the university. Students can also apply for an apartment from the Foundation for Student Housing in the Helsinki region (HOAS).

More information about housing is included in the information materials sent to you by your school – please read it carefully!

HEALTHCARE

The health care fee of the Finnish Student Health Service (FSHS) is included in the annual membership fee of AYY. You can receive help from FSHS in matters of general health, oral health and mental health. FSHS is a very affordable high-quality health care system created specifically for students. The majority of the FSHS services are free of charge, and even the highest appointment fees are very reasonable.

N.B. There is no emergency care in FSHS. EU/EEA students should still apply for a European Health Insurance Card and non-EU/EEA students need to have a private health insurance required by the residence permit.



ASSOCIATIONS AND STUDENT CULTURE

Taking part in dozens of fun activities every year is an essential part of studying in Finland. Make sure you won't miss the highlights of the year, such as Vappu festivities (around May Ist), anniversary balls, Shrove Tuesday sledging and many others.

International volunteer groups such as ESN Aalto and BEST organise awesome events in English throughout the year. 200+ associations operating within AYY include everything ranging from sports and music to games and other hobbies. New Aalto students are more than welcome to join the associations.

STUDENT ADVOCACY

AYY also represents students in different decision-making bodies of the university, and promotes their interests in society. Through student representatives, selected by AYY, students influence the decisions made at the University.

The international affairs sector of AYY works hard to promote international students' well-being in Aalto. The Representative Council is the highest decision-making body of AYY. It is elected in a ballot, in which all members of AYY, including international students, can vote and run as candidates. The next elections are this fall 2019!

OTHER SERVICES

AYY offers and provides its members various kinds of services and opportunities, from yearly calendars and student advocacy to awesome volunteering options. AYY members can rent AYY's sauna and festive premises for evening gatherings with friends, for example. AYY also has a van which the student union members can rent.

Guilds of ENG

What is a guild?

'Guild' is a general name for a subject association. A guild's main purpouse is to bring together students studying the same field. Many guilds have a long history. In total, there are 14 guilds in Otaniemi, all working under Aalto University Student Union (AYY).

Guilds are a very important aspect of Teekkari culture and are in charge of tutoring freshmen or new students. In general, a guild is a link between their respective degree program and the students.

What do the guilds offer?

Guilds organize parties, sauna afternoons, sitsis, company excursions and other fun events! Members of a guild can have the overalls of their own guild and wear them in student events.

Which guild should I join?

See the guilds of ENG on the next page. Don't be confused by the names of the guilds. In 2013 there was a reform of the guilds, when the main subjects studied in the guilds changed a bit. The guild names remained the same as always, and that's why the name of the guild is not always the same as the subject students are mainly studying.

You can join to a guild online on guild's website or by coming to the guild room and talking to one of the board members. The membership costs usually 8 euros.

Hello everyone and welcome to Aalto University!




Exchange Student Experience

Student life



Teekkari Culture and Traditions

Teekkari culture has a long history and traditions, which makes the student life here unique. Teekkaris are known as fun people, who often get into crazy projects. We encourage you to try out as many things and events as you can, it's sure fun! The most important aspect of being a teekkari is having fun and being a part of a community. Here's a few important aspects of the culture.

Teekkari Cap

Teekkari Cap is the symbol of teekkari. The cap has been used among technical students for over 100 years. It is white, hexagonal shape and has a black tassel. It is a summer cap, worn in 1.5.-30.9. To get a teekkari cap, new students have to collect freshmen points. It is fun and useful, as it helps students to integrate in the community. A person who hasn't accomplished the tasks and gotten the cap, isn't allowed to wear one. After gathering the points, new students get to put their cap on the midnight of the potentially organized Wappu.



Overalls

Most students in Finland have overalls, that are different colours, to distinguish what they are studying. Students traditionally decorate their overalls with badges and other stuff.



Sitsit

Sitsit are an academic table party, where a three-course meal is served, as well as drinks. The main point is to spend the evening together and sing. Singing is an important part of the teekkari culture and teekkaris love to sing. In sitsit, you get to sing for the whole evening by the lead of the song leaders. There is usually a dresscode for sitsit, it can be fancy or have a theme.

Wappu (May Day)

Wappu is the most important day of the year for teekkaris. It includes many traditions, like putting on and getting the caps, selling Wappu magazines, doing pranks, and much more you'll hear about later.

How to become a Teekkari

Collecting Freshmen Points

Freshmen points are collected with freshmen point cards. These cards have mandatory points that need to be completed, and voluntary points, from which you can choose enough points to complete at least the minimal amount required.

KvTMK has made their own English point card and has made it the international students in mind so even the exchange students that stay for half a year can earn their own teekkari cap. There's also Finnish point cards, and Master freshmen can choose whether they want to use the Finnish or english point card.


Collecting points is a lot of fun, and highly recommended!

KvTMK's point card:

Every point is counted as one and you need 30 points for the cap. (15 for exchange students that stay for a half a year)

Compulsory points (7 points):

- attend an international event
- become a member of your guild
- polytechnic museum
- singing test
- studies (15 ECTS)
- get to know a member of the international committee
- work point



Voluntary points (min 23 points):

Vary from events and guild activities, such as getting overalls, attending parties and sitsis, to different Finnish experiences, like learning Finnish phrases or going to sauna.

TF has long traditions and organizes a lot of different events open for everyone interested in Swedish. TF also has a student restaurant Täffä.


International Committee (KVTMK)

Of course, nothing stops you from joining several of them if you are interested! Most of the activity is in Finnish, but just ask and you'll surely get help.

Wappu: For a teekkari Wappu is Christmas, New year's, midsummer party and birthday combined.

Teekkari hymn: Anthem sang at midnight in darkness. Every Teekkari needs to know the lyrics (see back).

ENG: School of Engineering

KVTMK: The international committee, organizes events and integration for new Master's and exchange students

Telegram: Instant messaging app widely used in Otaniemi. Works like Whatsapp but with some crucial extras. Without this life in Aalto can be hard.

Sitsi: a dinner party where participants sit around tabels, enjoy three course meal, sing songs and drink. There are more formal sitsis with nice clothes and fine food and there are sitsis with more or leas eatable food on paper plates and lot of drinks.

Maari: Building full of computer classes, open 24/7.

Teekkarikylä: Finnish for Teekkari village. Home for many students of Aalto.

JMT: Short for Jämeräntaival, street in the heart of bachelor sode of Teekkari village and home of many parties and events.

SMT: Short for Servin Maijan tie, a bit quieter side of the Teekkari village.

SK:Short for Servinkuja.

OK: Short for Otakaari, the street that goes around Otaniemi.


OK20: Otakaari 20, it's a popular place for parties, and there is three spaces and a sauna in the building



When you have arrive: Register of residence in the Finnish Immigration Service (Migri) (required for EU citizens staying longer than 3 months) Registration to Finnish Population information system in Migri (required if you are staying for longer than a year) Open a bank account in Finland if needed (more information) Enrol as an attending student (in ENG learning services desk) Pay the AYY memberhsip fee (optional for exchange students) Apply for student card (see survival page) Get an HSL travel card and register your student discount Join the guild (see the guild pages)
