

Oltermanni's Advice

Welcome to Otaniemi and congratulations on your study position at Aalto University! Your life will have a totally new direction and content when you start your studies. You have to take much more responsibility of yourself, especially if you are moving away from your parents' home. The students who start at Aalto are selected so they are congenial in giving you peer support. There are still some uncertainties concerning how the studies are organized in fall 2020, and how much it is possible to organize contact teaching. I prefer contact teaching and I feel that it is the best way for fuksis. But if the situation is bad, the remote teaching works as well.

The studies of Computational Engineering are mainly theoretical including very little professional courses, which are mainly organized in master's phase. Therefore, it is vital to keep up your motivation and right attitude.

Probably some of you already know, what they want to do when they are "grown-ups". Yet, most of you don't have a clear picture of the professions and potentials. The best way to handle this problem is to acquire summer jobs from the field. These jobs can open your eyes, and maybe you can at least decide what you don't want to do. The bachelor programme has a lot of voluntary courses. With the help of the selection of By selecting the right course set, you can tailor your courses set to fit to your interests and to maintain your motivation.

Some practical instructions are:

- Think with your own brains, do not believe everything you are told.
- Study to learn – not to pass courses. Several skills and knowledge might be useful in your future career: most of you will have at least a couple of vacancies with varying contents.
- Find a study and career path which fits to you.
- Balance the work (that is studies) and fun.
- Take part into activities, don't stay alone. For example guild, hobby and professional clubs have a lot of possibilities.
- Remember to prioritize: you can not simultaneously study effectively, party, work and exercise world-class sports.

To ensure the access to your dream master programme, the best way to ensure access to your dream master's programme is to succeed in your studies. Quick studies and good grades secure the whole freedom of choice. It is worthwhile to check if your dream master's programme prefers some minors, like IT studies. Your academic advisor AA should be able to help you out here. Remember that you can do also courses outside School of Engineering and even outside Aalto.

Once you are in the master's studies you can concentrate on professional courses. There is a possibility to do exchange studies during master's or bachelor programme. One possibility is to acquire a summer job outside Finland.

The working life and its contents are changing quickly. Therefore the ability to stand on your own feet in the varying and uncertain situations is a significant skill. Similarly, the lifelong learning and accumulation of know-how are issues, which you can not avoid. That's why good learning skills are essential in the future.

I'm the Oltermanni of guild and my role is to act as a bridge between the students, and the professors and other staff of the school. I take part in some parties and keep in touch with the board. You can come to have a chat with me after lectures or pop up in my room at Rakentajanaukio 4.



Services

Student Benefits

As a student, you are entitled to hundreds of benefits, including Kela, Matkahuolto and VR discounts, as well as student lunch discount in student restaurants. Student discount in public transport in the metropolitan area is also available to you, as long as you live in the HSL area and have updated your student status in your travel card at the HSL service point. The same travel card also gives you access to certain university facilities!

Frank is a student service offering student cards and student discounts throughout Finland. Frank offers both digital and traditional plastic student cards.

The digital student card Frank App is an official student ID, which you can download and activate once you have registered for attendance at the university and paid the AYY membership fee. You can check the prices of other card options on Frank's website. You can also add an ISIC license to both digital and plastic student cards. More information about the different student cards can be found on Frank's website at FRANK.FI.

PLEASE NOTE! Once you have received the (plastic) card, please remember to pick up the academic year tag from AYY's service point!

Student Housing

AYY owns approximately 2,600 student apartments in Helsinki and Espoo. We offer a home for over 3,200 residents. All degree and exchange students who are members of AYY have the right to apply for AYY's housing. You can apply for housing as soon as your admission is confirmed by the university. First-year students and students moving from outside the Helsinki metropolitan area are given priority when allocating housing. You receive an extra applicant score when you apply for AYY's shared apartment queues as a first-year student. To receive the score, you must apply for housing no later than July or December, depending on when you start your studies. You can browse and search for AYY's apartments through the Domo system: DOMO.AYY.FI. As a student, you can also apply for housing from the Foundation for Student Housing in the Helsinki Region (HOAS).

Health Care

The health of university students is taken care of by the Finnish Student Health Service (FSHS).

As a member of AYY, you are entitled to general health, oral health, and mental health services of the FSHS. Most of the FSHS services are free of charge, including contacts and general health appointments, and paid services are also affordable.

When you register for attendance for the autumn term, the health care fee is paid as part of the student union membership fee. However, the responsibility for organising student health care for university students and collecting the health care fee will be transferred to Kela on 1 Jan 2021. Therefore, in the spring of 2021, the Student Union will no longer charge the FSHS fee in connection with the membership fee. The FSHS will continue to provide student health care services and they will be available to those who have paid the health care fee.

As of 1 Jan 2021, international exchange students, doctoral students, students in continuing education or tailor-made education will not be covered by the FSHS student health care. Further information: YTHS.FI.

Associations and Student Culture

Association activities and events are an essential part of Aalto's student culture. Highlights of the year include Wappu events, an-

niversaries, Shrove Tuesday celebrations and many other events starting right from the orientation week. AYY has more than 200 associations that organise activities ranging from sports to music and games to other hobbies. New students are more than welcome to join the associations. You should keep an open mind for different opportunities and get to know the associations in the upcoming events!

Advocacy and Interest Representation

AYY represents students in the university's decision-making bodies and promotes the interests of students in society. Through the student representatives elected by AYY, students have the opportunity to influence the decisions made at the university. AYY's highest decision-making body is the Representative Council, which is elected by vote. In the elections, all AYY members can vote and run as candidates.

Other Services

In addition to all this, AYY offers its members various services and opportunities ranging from a design calendar and scholarships to a wide range of volunteer positions. AYY also has numerous saunas, event venues and recreational facilities that members can rent. Some facilities are free of charge.

Teknologföreningen, TF, is the Swedish-speaking and the only student nation at Aalto. Everyone is welcome to TF despite study programme or language. The only requirement is to be interested to learn or speak Swedish. Teknologföreningen's place and own student restaurant are in Urdsgjallar, a big concrete building next to Dipoli. "Täffä"-members are recognized from their dark red, also known as technology red, overalls. Phuxivator is Sara.



Maanmittarikilta, The Guild of Surveying Engineers is the association for students in the degree program of Built Environment. MK, established in 1901, is the oldest guild still receiving new students every year. You can spot the members of the guild by their matte black overalls with a fuchsia colored sleeve. The MK guildroom, Monttu (it means a gob or a pit), is located at the K1 building. Guild's Fuksi Captain is Aku.



The Guild of Architecture was founded in 1908 and is Otaniemi's third oldest guild. It is home to students of Architecture, Landscape Architecture and Interior Design, so their members are a mix of students with either technical or artistic backgrounds. The Guild of Architecture's overalls are broken white and they are made of a very easily soiled cotton. The Landscape Architects can be identified by the self-drawn tree on the left leg, to which a leaf is added every Wappu. The logo on the back of the overalls is different each year, as it is designed by the fuksis themselves. Guild's Fuksi Captain is Aimi.



The Guild of Civil Engineers, more commonly known as "Raksa", is a subject association that was founded in 1913 and accepts undergraduates studying Energy and Environmental Technology. As of this year, they are also welcoming Computational Engineering students to their ranks. The association, which was originally named "Engineers' Club" (IK) is Otaniemi's third oldest guild that still accepts fuksis. Before 2013, the guild members majored in Building and Environmental Technology. Raksa members are easily identified by their builders blue overalls and their legendary chant of "RAKSA JAKSAA" ("Raksa perseveres!"). Guild's Fuksi Captains are Fanni and Sampo.



The Guild of Mechanical Engineers was founded in 1915 and is one of Otaniemi's largest guilds. This subject association, earlier for students of Mechanical Engineering and Energy Technology and from 2013 for students of Mechanical and Construction Engineering, is part of the School of Engineering, or ENG. KIK members can be recognized by their cheerful pink overalls, their pink caterpillar tractor mascot and their jubilant chants of "Yy, kaa, KO, NE!" ("one, two, THREE, FOUR / MACHINE"). Guild's Fuksi Captains are Jenny and Nelli.



Guilds of Otaniemi



The Guild of Electrical Engineers was founded in 1921 and will soon turn 100. The energetic and hard-working electrical engineers can be identified by their pure white overalls, the back of which sports their lightbulb logo. Their overalls are also decorated by a depiction of a telegram on their right thigh pockets. These overalls can be seen on SIK fuksis from day one, as they are the first guild to receive their overalls in Otaniemi. SIK's chant is "Jappadaida, jappadaida, Hei, hyvä SIK!"
Guild's Fuksi Captains are Emmaleena and Jonna.



The Guild of Physics (Fyysikkokilta aka FK) is a subject association, founded in 1947. It gathers under one roof, all of Aalto's Physics and Mathematics and now also Quantum Technology students. Each FK member later specializes in either physics, mathematics or system sciences, unless they study Quantum Tech. The guild's overalls are natural white, and to get the right shade, fuksis dye their overalls with tea. Guild's Fuksi Captains are Eero and Pinja.



The Guild of Industrial Engineers (Prodeko) was founded in 1966. Although the guild only has a small intake, their members are all the more active! Industrial Engineers can be recognised by their white overalls, which are decorated with rainbows. New fuksis design the overalls from the ground up and put them for the first time in November at the Sikajuhlat, to which you are also warmly welcome! Guild's Fuksi Captain is Severi.



Computer Science Guild is a student association founded in 1986. It gathers computer science students as well as the students of a new english bachelor programme Data Science. Computer Science Guild is one of the largest in Otaniemi. Members of the quild wear shiny black overalls with an unofficial '@-logo' in the back. Guild's Fuksi Captain is Heta.



The Guild of Automation and Systems Technology AS brings together students majoring in Automation and Control Engineering, Information Technology as well as Digital Systems and Designs. The industrious members can be recognised by violet overalls. The left sleeve is black with a white pocket and that reminds of shared history with TIK and SIK. Guild's Fuksi Captain is Leia.



Athene, the guild of information networks, is founded by its students in 1999. Despite its small size and young age, it is full of cheerful students. Athene's overalls are a forest or "Athena" green. The overalls' left sleeve is black as a tribute to when Athena separated from the Computer Science guild in 1999. The eye of Athene is the official logo which can be spotted from the overalls or wherever one sees Athenians. Guild's Fuksi Captain is Jaakko.



The Guild of Bioinformation Technology (Inkubio) was founded in 2007 and is thus Otaniemi's youngest guild. As the result of a historic spelling mistake, Inkubio's overalls are a reddish brown, and they are decorated with white "cow" patches, which guild members sew on themselves, to commemorate the time when they were part of the Guild of Electrical Engineers. On their backs, they proudly carry their logo, Maikki, a circuit board in the shape of a cow. Guild's Fuksi Captain is Essi.



Association of Process Engineering Students gathers Chemical Engineering students in whole Finnish programme and also in English bachelor programme. In 2012 founded PT is the youngest student association in Otaniemi. PT's overalls are blue and have three stripes on each limb as a reminder of three old guilds. The association's logo can be found on the back: it shows a bourdon tube pressure gauge measuring pressure, one of processes' most important variables. Guild's Fuksi Captains are Laura and Valtteri.

Teekkari Culture

The Teekkari culture is a strong uniting force that brings together the students of Technology in Otaniemi and beyond. At the heart of Teekkari culture are long standing traditions, a sense of belonging and an open and welcoming community that accepts everyone just as they are.

There isn't a single right way to become a Teekkari, it is an identity that is formed and developed throughout the fuksi year by taking part in Teekkari related activities, be it through your guild, an association or student union. The path to becoming a Teekkari is based on your own first-hand experience of the culture and there is no pressure to fit into a predefined role.

While Teekkari traditions play an important role and are still honoured in today's Teekkari community, it is far from stagnant and Teekkaris are always coming up with new fun and crazy things to do and incorporate into their culture.

Your tutors, Fuksi Captains and other guild members will accompany you on your journey to becoming a Teekkari and warmly welcome you into this enthusiastic and open-minded community.

Fuksi Points

In order to receive your Teekkari Cap with the other fuksis early in the morning of (the potential) Wappu-eve, you need to have shown throughout the year that you are worthy of wearing it. This is achieved by collecting fuksi points from various events. In order to keep track of your fuksi points, you will receive a card where the points are recorded.

The points are earned from different guild activities - for example singing evenings, sports and culture events, volunteering as a guild official, joining the course committee and of course going to guild parties. If all your free time is dedicated to your hobbies, then it is also possible to collect fuksi points from doing those through some other association. As such, it should not be a hindrance to getting your cap.

The idea behind the fuksi points is to introduce you to the Teekkari culture, its customs and traditions in a fun and multifaceted way. The idea is not to force you to attend every single party and drinking event, but more to encourage you to try a range of different activities in Otaniemi and find the things that you enjoy the most.

Teekkari Cap (Teekkarilakki)

The Teekkari Cap is one of the most distinctive and important marks of a Teekkari. It has been decorating the heads of the Teekkaris for over a hundred years, a sign of dignity and prestige.

Only Teekkaris are allowed to wear the cap, and even they are only permitted to wear it during the summer months (1st of May -30th of September), unless they have been granted special permission. This also means that fuksis do not wear the cap in their first year of studies, instead, it remains as a goal to earn your cap by collecting enough fuksi points.

The first time fuksis are allowed to put on their caps is at midnight on the eve of (the potentially organized) Wappu. This is a significant and ceremonial moment which is shared with other fuksis and guild members. When wearing the Teekkarilakki, you are representing a large community and it should be worn with the joy, dignity and decorum that are befitting of it.

Overalls

In addition to their tasseled caps, Teekkaris can also be recognised by their overalls. However, this isn't quite as straight forward, as other institutions of higher education also use overalls.

Overalls are worn on many occasions where Teekkaris are out and about in public. In other words, they could loosely be described as a Teekkari's uniform, however their main goal is to create a sense of belonging and community.

Overalls are decorated with badges and other thingamajigs that one has been able to trade and collect at student parties and other adventures. Almost every Otaniemi based association has their own badge and many events also make badges for you to collect. Some people believe that the only true way to obtain badges is by trading your own association's (eg. guild's) badges with others, in principle however, you can collect your badges in any way you wish (except of course illegally).

Sewing badges on to your overalls is a good way of spending your free-time, especially if you team up with other students and make an evening of it.

Otaniemi's guilds each have their own, unique overalls, so it is possible to identify the student's field of studies by the colour of their overalls. It is also important to remember that when wearing your overalls, you are representing all Teekkaris, so you should behave accordingly.

Our fuksis are amongst the first to receive their overalls - on the second day of the term.

Teekkari Culture

Tempaus (Campaign)

Every now and then are arranged campaigns (Tempaus). Those purpose are to wake interest of a big audience about some burning issue or common problem. Campaigns might be fund-raising for some good cause. Campaigns are not protests but those are made under team spirit. Campaigns are teekkaris way to have impact on things.

So far the greatest campaign must be from year 1968 when Dipoli was finished. Campaign was kind of removal campaign and it showed up as all kinds of events that were arranged all around Helsinki.

Latest campaign was arranged 2016 when it was arranged to appreciate Finnish comprehensive school.

Spex

Spex are interactive music and dance filled performances. The audience can at any point ask the performers to replay a scene by shouting "Omsart!". You can also add an order after the call, for example "Omstart, more German!", to which the performers instantly have to recreate the scene whilst adding the necessary injections of "Ach!", "Ich kommel!", or other such phrases. Each Spex performance is a fun and unique experience.

Wappu Magazines

Wappu magazines are one of the most well-known manifestations of being a Teekkari outside of Otaniemi. There are two Wappu magazines that are published in Otaniemi: Äpy in odd numbered years and Julku in even numbered years. The magazines are published about a week before Wappu, after which enthusiastic sales Teekkaris take to the streets of the capital region to find the best spots for selling their merchandise. Jäynä (Pranks)

Practical jokes are an integral part of Teekkari culture and they can often be seen in Otaniemi's daily life in the form of humorous tricks and installations. An authentic Teekkari Jäynä brings laughter to all involved parties by clever means. A Jäynä is often topical and engaging. A Jäynä should under no circumstances cause harm to anyone or anything, instead it should be an insightful prank or practical joke that in the end makes even the target of the joke laugh. It is always a good time to do a Jäynä. The best Jäynä ideas are worth submitting to the Jäynä competition the finals of which take place in the Spring's potential Wappu.

Couple of Important Words

When there's beginning a new chapter in your life, there's a fine change to observe action critically, whether it's your own or community's action. There's no complete community. There'll always be a change to develop community's action, and for that development are required brave people.

It's possible that you spot flaws or social evils in your own action, and it might be hard to admit those. Sometimes you might spot social evils on your friends action, when it's easier just to ignore those. Sometimes flaws are that big that those feel like impossible to fix.

Our Guild's Events

The purpose of our guild is to advocate our students' interests and organise activities that unite our students and support their studies. We organise a wide range of events, from sitsit to sauna evenings and from sports activities to study evenings. The idea is not to push everyone to do everything, but instead to offer something for everyone. Here is a small taster for some of the guild's better known events - keep your ears open, there will be more information later.



Hermannisitsi aka IK's Annual Ball

Annual Balls are academic festivities at their finest. They are the most distinguished of the Teekkari celebrations, and here in Otaniemi all-out white tie events.

Annual Balls start with a cocktail reception, where in addition to punch, you can enjoy the presentation of gifts from other guilds and associations showing their recognition. The gifts are usually both large and impractical.

The main celebration begins after the cocktail party, where you can enjoy a three course dinner with drinks. IK's annual ball: Hermannisitsit are traditionally one of Otaniemi's most song-filled Annual Balls. In connection with the meal, there is the custom to sing about what is drunk and drink what is sung about. The singing is interspersed with a wide range of speeches. At the end of the main festivities and after the traditional "vanhojen tanssit" (senior dance), the guests proceed on to the after party and the most daring of those from there to the afterafter party. When the morning dawns, the tired but cheerful partygoers are ferried to the Sillis (hangover brunch) which is the honour of that year's fuksix to organise.

The Hermannisitsit are celebrated each year on the Friday closest to the 11th of April. The Hermannisitsit (and our song book "Hermann") were named after the particularly well-liked and highly regarded Professor called Herman Hannelius at the beginning of the last century. The date of the Annual Ball is also determined by his birthday.

Sauna Evenings

Already tens of thousands of years ago, the primordial Teekkari refreshed his mind and physical well-being on the benches of the sauna. These hot traditions are still practiced by our guild. In addition to the Song and other sauna evenings, sauna also makes for an outstanding afterparty.

You are sure to find your way to Otaniemi's saunas: Rantasauna, Gorsu, Ota-kaari 20, Kattosauna, Avain-sauna and Ossinsauna.



Our Guild's Events



RILkamat

RILkamat is one of the Autumn's most eagerly awaited events. It is arranged entirely by that Autumn's Raksa fuksis (lead by Course Council) and an excellent opportunity to get to know more of your classmates. The RILkamat usually have a different theme each year and the idea is to dress up accordingly. Some examples of previous themes include: heaven vs. hell, high society/scruffy and last year's theme: childhood dream jobs.

The fuksis also prepare their first ever Spex for the RILkamat. It is easy to base the Spex on the theme of the evening, making the whole event into a nice package, both for the older students and especially for the organisers.

Sitsit

Sitsit are academic dinner parties, in which the celebrations are complemented by good food, drinks and lots of singing. Sitsit are very common in Otaniemi and are usually celebrated around a given theme, or just with style - but never too seriously.

The dress code for Sitsit can vary from casual to white tie. In normal Sitsit, men wear suits and women for example a cocktail dress or other appropriate clothes. Annual balls are of course in a league of their own as far as glamour is concerned. For themed Sitsit, the dress code is much more relaxed, depending on the theme of the evening.



Sitsit usually cost a little bit more than other events, but you definitely get your money's worth, as Sitsit include, almost without exception, a three course meal. Even more important than the food however, is the singing. When the Songmaster (lukkari) strikes the gong to announce the start of the next song, the cutlery is put down and conversations are put on hold. During the song and the speech that goes before, no one eats or speaks. A sign of a good Sitsit, is that there is no time to eat the food warm. There are other customs that belong to Sitsit, but you will learn more about these during the Autumn's sauna evenings and of course at the Sitsit themselves.

The fuksis first Sitsit are the "Fuksi sitsit" which will take place on the **20.9** with your tutors and other members of the Guild of Civil Engineers. Further Autumn Sitsit include at least the guild's half-year ball: 1/2-Hermann, the Fuksi Celebration Sitsit which is held for every guilds' fuksis and the MAIK Sitsit.

Although there are many rituals and customs that belong to Sitsit, there is no need to worry as there is plenty of time to learn them all. Neither is a lack of singing skills something that should keep you from attending a Sitsit - Teekkaris sing rather than well and there is always space next to the note!



Our Guild's Events



Kotimaan Pitkä - KP

The KP excursion is one of the Spring's most legendary events. The name KP comes from the finnish "Kotimaan pitkä" which translates to "homeland's long". The participants are chosen based on informal applications. The bus for this trip to somewhere in Finland departs early in the morning after the Kimble Cup. On the way, is the chance to get to know plenty of companies from the field and usually also other students from around the country. Many lose their sense of time on this long "night between Tuesday and Friday"** and the weekend comes as quite a surprise.

* This is a reference to a popular Finnish song, "Mada-fakin Darra", where the line "Tiistain ja sunnuntain välisen yönä" appears. Literally translated, this means "the night between Tuesday and Sunday", but it has been modified for the purpose of this text.

- If you are not familiar with the song, it is worth checking out as you are sure to hear it at a number of student parties in Otaniemi.



IK's Pre-Christmas Party

IK's pre-christmas party is celebrated towards the end of the year. The event takes place in the evening of the guild's annual election. In addition to christmas por- ridge (rice pudding) and Father Christmas, the evening programme has traditionally included confusing spec- tacles from both the first and second year students. As with all good parties, the pre-christmas party also has an after party. Will the captain get any gifts this year?



Norske Kimble Cup

At the dawn of Spring, the championship of the king of games: Norske Kimble (Ludo) will take place. One of the most fun childhood memories of the game, is the bubble in the middle of the board where the dice are bounced. In this version of Kimble there is indeed a bubble, but it will more likely be on your forehead*, as the pawns are in fact beer-filled receptacles. The aim of the game is simply to make it from the start to the finnish. However, on the way, the opponents may take out your pawns, in which case the affected team has to drink the contents of the pawn in question. The teams' costumes bring colour to the game and the tournament is very interesting to watch.

Studies

This section on studies, intended for students starting in 2020, will introduce you to the most important information systems, schedules and support services related to starting your studies and studying at Aalto University in general.

What is my Bachelor's Programme?

The Chemical Engineering, Computational Engineering, Data Science, Digital Systems and Design and Quantum Technology majors are all part of Aalto University's English-medium Bachelor's Programme in Science and Technology, jointly organised by all four Aalto schools of technology.

The Chemical Engineering major is run by the School of Chemical Engineering, Computational Engineering by the School of Engineering, Data Science major by the School of Science, Digital Systems and Design by the School of Electrical Engineering and finally, the Quantum Technology major is run jointly by the schools of Science and Electrical Engineering.

The contents of your studies depends on the major that gained admission to. Students in all majors are required to complete a 65-credit core curriculum, referred to as basic studies, which focusses on mathematical and computational methods. The degree programme also includes 65 credits of studies towards the major, 20–25 credits of studies towards the minor and 25–30 credits for electives. Once you have completed all these elements, you will be awarded a Bachelor of Science (Technology) degree worth 180 credits.

Timetables of the academic year

The first courses will start on Monday, 7 September 2020. Teaching in the academic year 2020-2021 is divided into five seven-week periods. The final week of each period is an evaluation week reserved for the finalisation of coursework, presentation of course results and evaluation of student performance with various methods. Classes may also be held during the final week.

In addition to the evaluation weeks, additional evaluation periods will be organised outside the teaching periods.

Studies

Timetable

As a first-year student, or fuksi in Finnish, you will be provided with a model timetable (or recommended study schedule) covering the courses that you are recommended to take in the first academic year. You can find the timetable on the programme website before the start of the academic year, and it will also be handed out to you on one of your first days on the Otaniemi campus.

If you follow the model timetable, you will earn the recommended amount of 60 credits in your first year. The first-year curriculum includes basic courses in programming, mathematics, industrial engineering and management, as well as a compulsory Introduction to Studies course and language courses. You should be prepared to work hard and invest time in your studies, because studying at the university level is different from studying at upper secondary school and requires more independent work.

Into

Into is the Aalto student portal for information on studies, university services and other matters relating to your future alma mater. The site is also a central hub for relaying Aalto news and current events information on to students. To get into Into, go to

Course registration policy

You need to register for each course you want to take. This is usually done online using the student register WebOodi; any courses that require different registration procedures will mention this on their course homepage found on the MyCourses portal.

Once you have registered for a course, you are also registered for any interim tests and for the final examination. Any different procedures are usually specified at the start of the course in class and on the MyCourses portal. If you are unable to attend an examination that you have registered for, please be sure to cancel your registration on WebOodi.

Each course is worth a specific number of credits, which will be entered into your student register when you have passed the course. By definition, 1 credit is equivalent to 26.7 hours of student work.

Studies

Completing courses

Course teaching methods vary and may include lectures, math assignments and group exercises or projects. Generally speaking, the first lecture will cover all the practical matters needed to pass the course (registration, examination, assignment, study material, course completion), so you have good reason to be there! Though lecture attendance is usually not compulsory, it is definitely beneficial from a learning standpoint.

Many courses have assignments, and in some cases they are compulsory. In other courses, you can do assigned work for extra credit to supplement the total points received on interim tests and the final examination. Whatever the case, maths exercises are always important, because they give you the opportunity to apply what you have learned in practice. In-class exercises in mathematics, called laskarit, include reviews of the subjects covered in the lectures. The exercises are often given out online in advance. In some courses, the maths exercises can also be completed as online assignments.

As first-year students tend to take the same courses, why not make the most of it by studying together? Many problems can be solved more easily by putting your heads together with your fellow students. Studying together is also much more fun, and working in a group can mean you're less likely to go off on a tangent.



Support and advice for studies

Studying at university requires more independent work than in high school or upper secondary school. As an adult, you are expected to learn how to find the information you need on your own. Fortunately, there are many sources of help available.

An academic advisor is assigned to every first-year student for the duration of their bachelor's studies, that is, the first three years. Advisors arrange both group and individual meetings with their students. Academic advisors belong to the university's research and teaching faculty, usually as professors, associate professors or university lecturers.

Academic advising is a form of guidance aimed at developing the student's own initiative and goal-setting, and at giving students the chance to get to know at least one academic staff member a bit better. During first-year studies, academic advising is a part of the Introduction

You can always turn to student services if you are unsure about where to start or whom to ask about something. The coordinator and planning officer of the programme, as well as other student services staff will be happy to help. Student services can assist you with matters involving:

- questions related to studies
- approval of your personal study plan (HOPS)
- graduating with a Bachelor or Master of Science (Technology) degree
- getting transcripts of records or certificates of student status
- registration for the academic year
- tuition-fee payments
- student exchange
- transfer of credits

In fact, student services can assist you with almost anything related to your studies, and if not, they can probably direct you to someone who can.

Student services for all majors of the Aalto Bachelor's Programme in Science and Technology are located in the Computer Science building, floor 1, corridor B. They can also be reached at bsc.tech@aalto.fi.

Professional Subject Associations

Professional Subject Associations Often called “AA clubs” (short for ammatiainekerho not anonymous alcoholics..), are associations for students who wish to deepen their connection to a specific subject and companies from that field. 
